What is a Region Rep?

A QBRC Region Representative represents their region in the council, focusing on Rover Scout engagement and communication. They coordinate activities, relay information, and ensure compliance. Key attributes include active Rover involvement, communication skills, and time management.

Responsibilities involve attending meetings, liaising with units, fostering community engagement, facilitating ballots, and supporting service spirit. They act as an ambassador, promote unit-level interactions, and build a unit contact network.

Who is the NRC?

The National Rover Council (NRC) are Executives, chosen by Branch delegates, who manage daily NRC operations. Responsibilities encompass executing Branch decisions, collaborating with branches for Rover initiatives, representing at national and international levels, and holding core positions like Chairperson, Vice-Chair, Finance Officer, and Secretary. Project Officers support them, and roles like Roverscope or Rover Centenary might be added for events and celebrations.

The QLD NRC Delegate & Observer work with the NRC on projects, initiatives, and papers, ensuring Queensland's voice and contributions are actively represented on the national stage.

QBRC Members

Chairman:

The Chairman drives growth and development of Queensland Rovers through leadership, governance, and representation. They ensure strategic goals alignment, guide the council, and promote Queensland Rovers.

Chair-Elect:

The Chair-Elect of QBRC assists the Chair in developing Queensland Roving. They aid executive members, with a focus on Event Chairs, as well as requiring commitment and personal growth for their future Chair role.

Secretary:

The Secretary handles official Council tasks: recording minutes, communication, and correspondence. Clear communication and organization are crucial for transparency, accountability, and member support.

Program Officer:

The Program Officer ensures access and understanding of the rover program for Queensland Rovers. They source activities and share information for engaging scouting adventures.

IT Officer:

The IT Officer manages communication tech for Queensland Rovers, adapting to skills and interests. They ensure positive online experiences, aiding goals through technology for enhanced member support state-wide.

Training Officer:

The QBRC Training Officer promotes ongoing development, valuing training for Rovers' growth in all roles. They encourage pursuit of various training levels to enhance leadership and skills, ultimately raising standards.

Membership Officer:

The Membership Officer is responsible for fostering a thriving and engaged community. They oversee member relations, facilitate recruitment efforts, and ensure a strong sense of belonging within Queensland Rovers.

Finance Officer:

The QBRC Finance officer ensures financial accountability and sustainability. They manage finances, make informed decisions, emphasize compliance, and handle budget requirements for QBRC and its events.

Marketing Officer:

The Marketing Officer leads marketing and promotion for Queensland Rovers, aiming for membership growth via retention and new sign-ups. This role involves team leadership and local community engagement.

Resources Officer:

The QBRC Resources Officer manages purchasing, maintenance, and deployment of Rover assets. They advise on equipment acquisition and readiness for State and Region events, minimizing costs and uncertainties.
